

NON-PROFIT RESIDENCE VISA

Visa that allows the applicant, who has to submit proofs of enough financial means to cover the living expenses, to reside in Spain for one year without carrying out any profitable-gainful (work or professional) activity. This visa does not constitute a work permit.

The following family members may apply for a visa: The spouse or unmarried partner and/or dependent children (maximum aged 25 years old).

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS	CHECKING	NOTES
Duly completed <u>national application form</u> signed by the applicant or by both parents if the applicant is minor.		
One recent passport photograph in colour with a white background, frontal view (3.5 x 4.5 cm) according to ICAO regulations.		
Original passport with a minimum validity of 1 year.		
Note: If applying with a foreign passport, one of the following documents must be provided:		
 A Lebanese or Syrian Passport *, A Lebanese or Syrian ID or Civil Register ("EKHRAJ KAID FARDE") *, A valid residency permit in Lebanon or Syria ("IKAMA") *. 		
Photocopies of the biometric data page and of page/s where previous visas are stamped (Schengen, USA, UK and/or Canada) of the current passport and/or previous passports.		
Duly completed <u>non-working residence visa application form</u> (EX-01) signed by the applicant or by both parents if the applicant is minor.		
Duly completed <u>residence permit payment of fees form 790 code</u> <u>052</u> signed by the applicant or by both parents if the applicant is minor.		
Note: The fee related to this form may be paid in Spain before applying for the visa or it may be paid at BLS office upon submitting the visa application.		
<u>Criminal record certificate</u> ("SEJEL AADLEH / LA HOKM AALE") issued by the authorities <u>of the country of origin and all countries where the applicants have resided during the last 5 years</u> and where it is shown that the person has not been sentenced for offences included in the Spanish Penal Code *.		
It has to be legalized by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the country that has issued the document.		
This document should have a <u>maximum validity of 3 months</u> on the moment it is handed with the application.

THE POLICE CERTIFICATES ISSUED OUTSIDE LEBANON AND/OR SYRIA SHOULD ALSO BE LEGALISED BY THE EMBASSY OF SPAIN LOCATED IN THE COUNTRY WHERE THEY WERE ISSUED OR APOSTILLED ACCORDING TO THE HAGUE CONVENTION.	
<u>Family register</u> (IKHRAJ QAYD AA2EELE) <u>legalized by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs</u> of the country that has issued the document *.	
Notarized travel consent from the parent who is not applying for the visa is required for minors *.	
Proof of sufficient economic means in order to support the expenses of residing in Spain for the initial year of the residence permit, or accrediting that the applicants have a regular source of income, for themselves and, where applicable, for the family members accompanying them.	
The monthly minimum amount required is the equivalent of 400% of Spain's Public Multiple Effects Income Indicator (IPREM) for the applicant. This amount will be increased in 100% of the IPREM for each family member.	
 For adult children, documents proving financial dependence, the adult child's civil status and that they continue to form part of the family unit. 	
Examples of documents:	
 Detailed bank statements of at least the last year, Investments, Annuities, and/or Any other source of income. 	
Note: Scanned copies or photocopies of the statements are not accepted; only original and official copies signed and stamped by the bank.	
A healthcare/medical insurance, either from a Lebanese or a foreign company, covering the entire period of the intended stay in Spain (min. 1 consecutive year), provided that the insurance company is authorized to operate in Spain and has an assistance office within Spanish territories.	
The insurance needs to have a 100% coverage of medical treatment, hospitalization, and emergency admission to hospitals.	
Note: Travel insurance policies are not valid.	
Medical Certificate including literally one of the following formula *:

This is to certificate that the applicant (state the name of the concerned person) does not suffer of any kind of illness that could generate severe repercussions on Public Health, according to the 2005 International Sanitary Regulation. o In Spanish:	
Este certificado médico acredita que (state the name of the concerned person) no padece ninguna de las enfermedades que pueden tener repercusiones de salud pública graves, de conformidad con lo dispuesto en el Reglamento Sanitario Internacional de 2005. Any medical doctor registered in the Order of Physicians/Doctors may issue this certificate. This document should have a maximum	
validity of 3 months since its issue date.	
Visa fee (amount in USD equivalent to 80 euros).	

All documents written in a different language from Spanish have to be handed with a translation into Spanish by a juror translator.

*The originals and the copies of all the documents must be handed.

If needed for the assessment regarding the application, the Embassy may ask the applicant to submit any documents or additional data and to call the applicant for an interview.

Once the visa is approved, the applicant has a maximum of 1 month to retrieve the visa in person. Otherwise, the Embassy will consider that the applicant has renounced the right to get the visa and the application will be filed.

Applicants may leave the passport at BLS office or retain it during the processing of the application. If the visa is approved, it will only be delivered once the applicant hands his passport back to the Embassy.
