



ENTREPRENEUR VISA AND FAMILY MEMBERS OF THE ENTREPRENEUR

Visa for foreigners moving to Spain to carry out the procedures necessary to undertake an innovative, entrepreneurial activity of particular economic interest for Spain, according to Law 14/2013, de 27 de septiembre, de apoyo a los emprendedores y su internacionalización.

The following family members of the entrepreneur may apply for a visa: the spouse or unmarried partner, children and adult children who are financially dependent on the worker and who have not created a family unit of their own and relatives in the ascending line in the worker's care.

<u>Photocopies of the biometric data page and of page/s where previous visas are stamped</u> (Schengen, USA, UK and/or Canada) <u>of the current passport and/or previous passports.</u>	<input type="checkbox"/>	
<u>Permit approval issued by the Large Companies and Strategic Groups Unit of the Ministry of Inclusion, Social Security and Migration.</u> *	<input type="checkbox"/>	
<u>Criminal record certificate</u> (“SEJEL AADLEH / LA HOKM AALE”) issued by the authorities <u>of the country of origin and all countries where the applicants have resided during the last 2 years</u> and where it is shown that the person has not been sentenced for offences included in the Spanish Penal Code *. <u>It has to be legalized by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs</u> of the country that has issued the document. This document should have a <u>maximum validity of 3 months</u> on the moment it is handed with the application. <u>Only applicable to applicants above 18 years old.</u> <u>THE POLICE CERTIFICATES ISSUED OUTSIDE LEBANON AND/OR SYRIA SHOULD ALSO BE LEGALISED BY THE EMBASSY OF SPAIN LOCATED IN THE COUNTRY WHERE THEY WERE ISSUED OR APOSTILLED ACCORDING TO THE HAGUE CONVENTION.</u>	<input type="checkbox"/>	



<u>Declaration of responsibility</u> signed by the applicants stating the absence of criminal record <u>in the countries where they have resided during the last 5 years.</u>	<input type="checkbox"/>

All documents written in a different language from Spanish have to be handed with a translation into Spanish by a juror translator.

***The originals and the copies of all the documents must be handed.**

If needed for the assessment regarding the application, the Embassy may ask the applicant to submit any documents or additional data and to call the applicant for an interview.

The legal period for reaching a decision is minimum 10 days as of the day after the submission date of the application, but this period may be extended when an interview or additional documents are requested.

Once the visa is approved, the applicant has a **maximum of 1 month to retrieve the visa in person.** Otherwise, the Embassy will consider that the applicant has renounced the right to get the visa and the application will be filed.

Applicants may leave the passport at BLS office or retain it during the processing of the application. If the visa is approved, it will only be delivered once the applicant hands his passport back to the Embassy.
